Dr Robin Peace is an educator, writer and an evaluator who engages and inspires people. She is currently an Associate Professor at Massey University's School of People, Environment and Planning and Programme Coordinator of Massey's postgraduate social sector evaluation research programme. Prior to that, Robin was a lecturer in human and cultural geography at the University of Waikato where she also attained her doctorate on social exclusion policies in the European Union, and as a teacher and Head of Department in Geography in a number of Wellington secondary schools.
